





Completing an Auralia Task

In your Class Overview, you will see you have an assignment. Once you click on it, you should be taken to a page that looks like this:



Make sure to check the task description for any additional materials your teacher may have provided you. By clicking on "Open in Auralia," you will be redirected to your assignment.




